TEXTILE BANK AT BISHOP PERRIN SCHOOL

The UK is the fourth largest producer of textile waste in Europe, according to a new study. Clothes can take up to 40 years to decompose and shoes can take up to 1000 years to break down. However 95% of textiles can be recycled.

We have a textile bank, provided by Astra Recycling, down the side path of the School. Our main aim is to promote recycling and prevent used clothing ending up in landfill. In addition we will also be able to raise money for school as we will receive a small payment for each kilogramme of textiles donated. Most donations will be shipped to Eastern Europe or Africa to be worn again. Any textiles that cannot be reused are converted into industrial cleaning wipes or insulation materials.

We **accept** the following wearable items:

- All men's, ladies and children's clothing including School Uniform
- Paired Shoes
- Handbags, bags, ties and belts
- Bed linen, towels, soft toys

We **cannot** accept:

- Duvets, pillows or cushions
- Carpets or rugs
- Used underwear or socks
- Curtains
- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material
