PREPARING FOR TRANSFER TO SECONDARY SCHOOL WEBINAR

Jonathan Rourke of <u>SENDIASS</u> will be presenting a webinar for ADHD Embrace on Tuesday 31st January about the needs of children with ADHD as they prepare for secondary school.

Jonathan will talk about the process of transferring from primary to secondary school and how best to navigate this so that parents can best support their child. Whether or not your child has this diagnosis, you may find this a useful session to build you knowledge and understanding of how SEN needs are met at secondary school and how to navigate the transition process.

The webinar will also cover the things parents/carers of a child with ADHD should consider when selecting a secondary school for their child, as well as the role of the SENCO in a senior school.

Jonathan will also talk about the <u>Kids SENDIASS</u> service for those who are not already familiar with what they offer

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WORLD BOOK DAY

World Book Day is on Thursday 2nd March this year, but as this is potentially another strike day, we will be holding our World Book celebrations on Friday 3rd March. As usual, we will be celebrating in school by encouraging the children to read a brand-new book. We ask that all children choose a book from the attached list. These books have all been shortlisted for the SPARK! Book Awards 2023.

The children will read their chosen book at home in advance of World Book Day. On the day they can come to school either dressed as a character or bring in a prop, inspired by their chosen book. During the day, they will gather with all the other children who have chosen to read the same book as them, along with a member of staff, for a book club discussion and activity.

CHILDREN'S WELLBEING PRACTITIONER - APPLICATIONS WELCOME

Are you concerned about your child's anxiety levels? Do they find it difficult to separate from you? Are they having difficulties with sleep, or with friendships, or coming to school?

Are you finding it difficult to manage some of your child's tricky behaviours (for example not following instructions, following bedtime routines, having tantrums, being rude)?

Children's Wellbeing Practitioners offer two programmes of support which you might find helpful.



Kathy is a Children's Wellbeing Practitioner who is based in our school on Tuesdays. She works 1:1 with parents/carers to provide tools and strategies which will have a positive impact on mild to moderate levels of childhood anxiety and/or behavioural difficulties. These interventions are called Guided Self-Help and are offered as programmes consisting of 6 – 8 sessions. Guided self-help is based on Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) and means that you and Kathy will work together to help you manage the current difficulties by practising a range of skills which will give support in the future. A number of our current parents have committed to work with Kathy and found her support to be very impactful and supportive. If you would like to self-refer for this service, please talk to Mary McAvoy, Inclusion Leader, or complete the attached referral form and return it to school. New applications are welcomed to begin the programme towards the end of February.
