They came to help us review our practices and systems across the school with regards to teaching and learning, our teaching of reading, our curriculum and governance. It was a very intense day, but also very positive and informative. The children's behaviour during their lessons and at lunchtime was acknowledged as being really good, and they were confident and articulate in their responses when spoken to by Mrs Newman and Mrs Clarke. There were lots of strengths and positives noted, especially the high standard of our planning for the delivery of the curriculum. Father David and Mrs Williams, our Chair and one of our Joint Vice-Chairs, were able to join myself and Miss Macklearn for some feedback at the end of the day, and we were really pleased to hear about Mrs Newman and Mrs Clarke's positive perspective about the school. They were able to give us some good areas for development which we will start working on immediately, but all in all, it was a really helpful and insightful experience for all involved. I would like to thank all the staff who put a lot of effort, thought and planning into the day, to the Governors who were able to attend their own specific session during the day, to the parents who spoke to Mrs Clarke at the beginning of the day and finally to the children, who are the greatest ambassadors for us.
