### **School Life**

Our first full week has whizzed by and it has been lovely to welcome all our new Reception children into school over the past three days. They have started in small groups of 10 on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday this week and they will all then be in as of next week, initially for some half-days. We have been impressed at their maturity at coming into school and how quickly they have settled and begun to forge new friendships.

We had another lovely whole-school Hymns of Praise yesterday on the playground, led by Mrs Place. The children sang beautifully and it was great that we are able to gather as a school community for the purpose of coming together and singing together.

We have received some positive feedback from parents about how much the children are enjoying the freedom of the playground without barriers and restrictions and that they can get to go on the Activity Trail and play basketball and football. We're slowly moving in the right direction! With regards the Activity Trail and its use after school, we are happy for children to use the apparatus on the Activity Trail but it must be under supervision of a parent/carer as the school cannot be responsible for this.

Our numbers at Breakfast Club and Koosa Kids have been higher this week, so thank you for your support with these services, and if you need to use them, please make sure you book through in plenty of time

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## DROPPING OFF ARRANGEMENT FOR CHILDREN IN YEARS 1-6

As of next week, children should wait outside on the pavement with their parents until the main double gate is opened at 8.30am. Children should not come onto the school site via the single side gate before 8.30am. At 8.30am, both the double gates to the Forecourt and the gate to the playground will be opened, so all the children can head straight onto the playground without having to queue down the side alley. Our aim is to always have a member of staff available on the Forecourt, but this might not always be possible. It is for this reason that children should not be on the school site before 8.30am as there is no one from the school staff to supervise them.

#### YEARS 5 & 6 WALKING TO AND FROM SCHOOL

If your child is in Years 5 or 6 they may walk to and from school by themselves. Please email the school office or send in a note if your child has permission to do this.

They may not bring younger siblings.

The school office holds a separate "Walk to School" register so that we can check that children who walk alone all arrive safely each morning. Please call the school office before 9.15am if your child is not attending school.

#### **CHILDREN EATING HOT DINNERS**

Staff who have been on duty in the Hall at lunchtime have noted that there are many children who have limited cutlery skills when coming to using a knife and fork. Younger children are helped to cut larger items of food, but there are many children who are lacking basic cutlery skills. If your child is going to have a hot dinner, please spend time with them at home teaching them how to use a knife and fork correctly and how they should present their cutlery on their plate once they have finished their meal. Your help and support for this will be much appreciated.
