Although we still have had around 20 children off school this week with Covid, along with a lower number of staff absence than last week, we seem to be over the worst of things. We are still maintaining all our Covid risk assessment measures in school, and will continue to do so until we feel it safe enough to lift them. Thank you for all your support with arranging PCR tests for your children when we have asked you to do so. We appreciate that it can be inconvenient, but it helps ensure that we can keep classes as safe as possible. I would ask that if you are called by a member of staff requesting that you collect your child from school if they are showing symptoms, or you call the school to clarify return dates or anything else Covid-related, that you do so politely and respectfully, as the staff are only doing their job in line with all our procedures and risk assessments.

Parking Outside the School

Thank you for being responsive to the request last week not to park on the island outside the school. From observations, there have been far less cars being parked on the island, however, it has been disappointing to hear of dangerous and inconsiderate parking at the junction/corner of Ashley Drive and the slip road outside the school. Please consider the safety of the children, pedestrians and other road users.

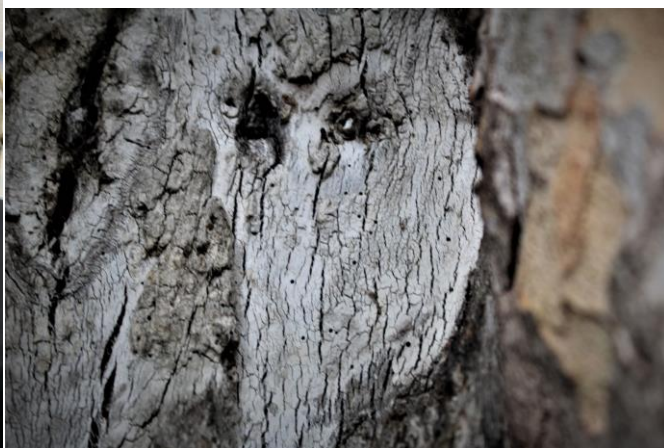
