POTTED PLANTS PLEASE

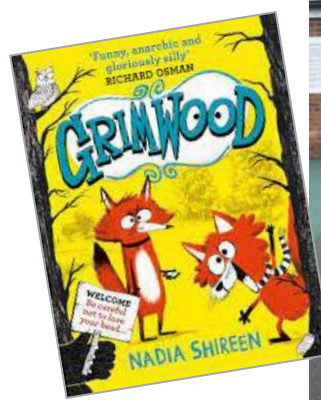
