#### School uniform

Our updated <u>school uniform policy</u> will be implemented from the start of next term. We encourage you to read it before purchasing any new items over the holidays. We very much appreciate your support in helping your child adhere to the policy.

#### **Required Summer Uniform**

Children must wear summer uniform for the whole summer term. They may choose to continue to wear summer uniform for the first half term of the autumn term, but must change to winter uniform when they return from the October half term holiday.

School jumper / cardigan White polo shirt (logo optional) with Grey knee-length skirt / pinafore / culottes / trousers / knee-length shorts or Either yellow and white striped or checked dress (white cycling shorts may be worn underneath dresses for modesty reasons) White, grey or black ankle / knee-length socks or white tights with summer dress

Black school shoes

A few other reminders that will be helpful:

- No trainers please, unless it's a PE day
- No jewellery except for a wrist watch and single stud
- earrings (unless for religious reasons)
- Smart watches are not permitted
- Make-up and nail varnish are not permitted and children
- will be asked to remove it if they are wearing it to school
- Outdoor coats to be of a dark colour

• For health and safety reasons, long hair must always be tied back and hair accessories kept to a minimum and of school colours

• For safety reasons, children are not permitted to have key rings, bag tags or other accessories attached to their school bag other than reflective safety tags

Children are strongly encouraged to wear caps (optional) during hot weather for protection from the sun. This can be a school Bishop Perrin School baseball cap which is available from School Days and Just Dancing. Other caps, must be logo-free and a plain, dark colour.


