RICHMOND SCHOOL SPORT GYMNASTICS FESTIVAL

Last Friday eleven of our children took part in the Richmond School Sport Gymnastics Festival at Waldegrave School.

Bishop Perrin came 7th out of the ten teams participating and Max was awarded the bronze medal in the overall boys' competition.

They came up against some formidable opposition from many children who belong to gymnastics clubs and train most days of the week, most of our children only do a weekly session at school.
