Scooters and Bikes

If your child is coming to school on their scooter or bike, please remind them to dismount before they get to the boundary fence of the school, as the pavement area is very congested in the morning. This also applies to parents who are cycling, as we want to make sure we avoid any collisions and injuries. Scooters are not to ridden by children on the playground after school, so please ensure your child Is not doing this as the playground is very busy and congested and scooters damage the soft wet pour surface surrounding the Activity Trail.

The Activity Trail

We are very fortunate to have our Activity Trail on the playground, and the children love using it during the school day to help develop their gross motor skills and upper body strength. Children are welcome to use the Activity Trail at the end of the school day, but his is on the condition that they are supervised by their responsible adult (parent/carer/childminder). We have clear rules and guidance that the children follow during the school day (which are on the walls of the playground), and these rules should be adhered to if you allow your child to use the Activity Trail after 3.15pm. There are occasions when non-school age siblings are using the Activity Trail with minimal supervision from parents/carers. The last thing that we would want is an injury to a child from using the Activity Trail as a result of not being supervised by their responsible adult. School staff are not responsible for supervising children on the Activity Trail, but will speak to them if they are not using the equipment safely or in line with our playground rules.
