Headteacher's Hello

Dear parents and carers,

How lovely to have some beautiful sunshine this week, particularly for our Year 5 class who have been away in the Isle of Wight. We have had regular updates from them and by all accounts they are having a fabulous time! We're looking forward to hearing all about their adventures when they get back later this afternoon. A huge thank you to Mrs Rogerson, Mrs Jasper, Mis Murray and Mr Towns for giving up their time to accompany the children on the trip; for looking after them while they were away and making sure they had a wonderful time.

This afternoon, Year 2 are busy with their scooter training. As part of our safety education programme, all children in Year 2 get the opportunity to participate in the training, helping them to be responsible citizens when they're out and about on their scooters.

Yesterday, we bid a fond farewell to Fr. John as he led his last collective worship in school for us. The children sang a special song for him and presented him with some beautiful cards they had made. We are so grateful for all the support Fr. John has given us, and we will miss the joyful collective worship and church services that he has led for us over the years. Fr. John's last service at St. Augustine's will be on Sunday 30th June.

As mentioned in one of my previous newsletters, Madame Goalen will be leaving us at the end of this term. We have taken this opportunity to review the foreign languages curriculum offer at Bishop Perrin School which for many years has been French. However, we are finding that Spanish is now more commonly taught at secondary schools, and French less so. Therefore, in consultation with staff and governors we have decided to make the transition to teaching Spanish from September so as to provide children with a strong foundation for learning a foreign language that they are more likely to encounter at secondary school. Spanish is also more phonetic which makes it easier to speak and write at the same level, which links with the way we teach early reading. We will still aim to offer French through our club provision, La Joli Ronde. Those children who already have a strong foundation in French from their lessons with Madame Goalen will have good transferrable skills to learn the basics of a new foreign language.

Good luck to our school choir who will be performing at the St. Phillips and St. James' May Fair tomorrow. The fair will be held in the church grounds from 12 – 4pm, with the choir performance at approximately 2pm. Thank you Mrs Place for supporting the choir with this.

We wish Year 6 good luck for next week when they will be taking their SATs in mathematics, reading, spelling, grammar and punctuation. They have worked very hard in preparation and we are very proud of the determined and conscientious attitude they have shown over the last few weeks. We know that they will do their very best.




