## EDUCATIONAL VISITS

### YEAR R

On Wednesday 8th June 2022, Reception Class will visit Bocketts Farm.

They will leave school at 09:00 AM, travelling by coach, and return by 3:00PM.

#### Packed Lunch -

Every child in the class is entitled to receive a packed lunch provided by the school caterers. To order one please follow the steps in the email sent to you this week and complete your food order by 25<sup>th</sup> May. Alternatively, you can provide your child with a packed lunch from home.

### YEAR 1

On Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> May 2022, Year 1 will visit the Museum of Richmond travelling by Southwest Trains.

Packed Lunch – thank you to those who have ordered a school provided packed lunch, this has been ordered with the catering team ahead of next week's trip. If you haven't ordered a school provided lunch please provide your child with one from home for the trip on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> May.

Children must wear school uniform and all children will need to bring their water bottle with them on the trip.

### YEAR 2

On Thursday 9th June 2022, Year 2 will visit London Zoo, travelling by coach.

### YEAR 3

Year 3 will be visiting Twickenham Stadium on Tuesday 14th June. They will take part in a tour and murder mystery detective workshop.

Children will use the local bus to and from Bishop Perrin School to Twickenham Stadium.

You will need to supply your child with a packed lunch for this trip and their bottle of water. Children will need to wear their school uniform.

### YEAR 4

## SCHOOL OPEN MORNING – Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> May

On Thursday 26th May 09:00 – 11:00 AM we will hold a School Open Morning here at Bishop Perrin Primary School.

This is a great opportunity for you to see first-hand what school is like for your child, for many of you it will be your first experience inside our school due to the pandemic preventing this previously. Your child(ren) are looking forward to sharing their work, classroom and we also encourage you to explore the wider school and other year groups.

Your child will be sharing further detail with you in the coming week, but for now, here's some important information about the morning;

- Doors will open at 8.45am, please make your way to the Main Hall for Mr Corke's welcome
- Parents will be asked to sign in and out of the building for fire regulations. If it is dry we will aim to set these tables up in the forecourt to ease the pressure coming in to the building
- Buggies/pushchairs will need to be left outside (at the owners' risk) as they will be hazardous in the event of fire/evacuation
- If anyone has a disability and requires help/support, please let us know in advance
- Parents must only use the Visitor Toilet – opposite schools main office, not staff or children's toilets
- After Mr Corke's welcome in the Hall parents will then be able to visit their child's class and encouraged to also visit the other classes around the school
- Grandparents are also welcome to attend
