YOUTH SPORT TRUST

On Wednesday 11th May the Youth Sport Trust launched its new long-term strategy 'Inspiring Changemakers, Building Belonging'.

The research, commissioned by the Youth Sport Trust and conducted by YouGov, shows 83% of GB parents are concerned that children are spending too much time online and not enough time with one another. The findings also revealed that 80% of parents say that cuts to PE, sport and break times in school have a negative impact on young people's wellbeing.

The Youth Sport Trust wants every young person to learn in a healthy way what belonging really feels like, and for young people to have a positive personal identity which comes from play and sport.

The research among UK parents of children aged 18 and under carried out by YouGov found:

- 83% of parents are concerned that children are spending too much time online and not enough time with one another
- 81% of parents are concerned that young people aren't getting enough physical activity
- 80% of parents say that cuts to PE, sport and break times in school have a negative impact on young people's wellbeing.

Over the next 13 years of its new strategy, the Youth Sport Trust will dramatically change its approach to support those most in need. Starting locally and building momentum, it will galvanise and inspire changemakers to transform attitudes, improve practice and drive policy change.

The charity hopes that together the power of play and sport can be harnessed to build belonging for a generation, improving their health, fostering inclusion and developing character and leadership.
