School Life

It has been a very busy and productive week, culminating in a very special visit this afternoon by Mr and Mrs Perrin and their daughter, Dr Perrin, to officially open the Outdoor Classroom. However, I'll share all the things that have happened this week as it has unfolded.

Monday saw all the classes have their photos taken, and they did this really well and maturely. Year 2 started their end of Key Stage 1 tests, and have shown great determination and endurance over the course of the week, and I know Miss Lancaster is very proud of all of them.

Tuesday saw Mrs Crinall and Mrs Stock take ten children from Years 3, 4 and 5 to Nelson School to take part in some training to become Anti-Bullying Ambassadors, which is funded by the Princess Diana Fund. The children were really well behaved and will now start working with Mrs Crinall and Mrs Stock on how they can share their training with the rest of the school. On Tuesday afternoon Year 5 also went to Nelson School, but this was for a singing rehearsal with Year 5 classes from Nelson and St Edmund's School for their Singing Festival in June.

On Wednesday we had our first Governor RE and Vision Learning Walk in a couple of years with Father David and Mrs Williams accompanying Mrs Crinall around the school. This also linked in with Mr Nimmo and Mrs Alladin, two of our other Governors, meeting children from Years 1-6 to talk about their learning in Science and DT. All the Governors were able to report back on how well behaved, articulate, enthusiastic and knowledgeable the children were about all the things they have been learning. I am very grateful to Father David, Mrs Williams, Mr Nimmo and Mrs Alladin for giving their time to come in to school and to meet the children.

Thursday was quieter than expected as Year 5 were meant to have a Shakespeare workshop in the Hall, but unfortunately the visitors who were coming to lead it were unwell, so we will get that re-scheduled.

Which brings us to today and the wonderful opportunity to thank both the Perrin Family and the Twigg Family for their generous donations to help us complete our Outdoor Classroom. Along with some of our Governors, we were able to watch Mr Perrin cut the ribbon to the gate that leads into the Outdoor Classroom and to hear Father David bless it. The Choir sung beautifully at the opening ceremony and again during our special assembly in the Hall where all the children were able to meet Mr and Mrs Perrin and Dr Perrin as well as hear Mr Perrin share some words about Bishop Perrin and the lovely relationship we have forged between the school and their family. I am very grateful to all the staff who have helped in establishing the Outdoor Classroom, especially Miss Macklearn and Mrs Forster, along with Mrs Chawla who has helped with the planning and organisation of today's special "opening". I would also like to again extend the school's thanks to both the Perrin and Twigg families for their generosity and support.

We are very excited to be able to share plans for Phase 1 of our capital investment programme with the introduction of the Aspire Centre! Carefully designed to give students a state-of-the-art learning environment to use before, during and after school to support and enhance their learning experience, the Aspire Centre will be equipped with 31 new computers, a large interactive screen, a dedicated teaching zone and living wall to reflect our journey of growth. Alongside this, we will be installing new interactive whiteboards in all classrooms, updating all desktop computers throughout the school, transforming our corridor and circulation areas and completing extensive remedial works within our playground.
