## Governor Meeting Highlights

A Full Governing Board meeting took place on Wednesday 7th June and during the meeting the Governors were delighted to hear the positive feedback from some recent reviews conducted by Local Authority Advisors looking at both Special Educational Needs and Early Years. For both reviews, the advisors were able to identify lots of strengths in the practice of the school and have given some feedback on areas for the school to keep focusing on and improving. Miss McAvoy, who is the school's Inclusion and EYFS Leader, shared with the Governors all the work she has been undertaking this academic year and they thanked her for her leadership in both roles. The Governors were very impressed to hear that all thirty children from Year 5 had been able to enjoy the school journey to the Isle of Wight and May and were thankful to the school staff who gave up their time to take the children. During the meeting the Governors spoke about the new school website and how much easier was to navigate and find information for parents. The Governors were grateful to all the staff who had worked on developing the new website. Lastly the Governors were delighted to hear the news that day that Bishop Perrin School had won the Small Schools' element of Borough Sports at St Mary's University and congratulated all the children who represented the school. The meeting closed with a prayer by Father David.
