GOVERNORS MEETING UPDATE

The Governors met for a Full Board meeting on Wednesday 18th May.

The Governors received a presentation from Miss Macklearn as Subject Lead for History and were informed about how the school's History curriculum is sequenced across Yeas 1-6 for the National Curriculum and how this links with the history themes taught in Reception Class. Miss Macklearn was able to talk about how the different history themes show progression as the children move through the school and as often as possible, themes are linked to the local area to help the children get a greater understanding of where they live and how it has changed over time.

Governors congratulated Year 6 for taking their SAT's this half term. They would also like to thank the all the staff for providing excellent wrap around care and support for the children that week.

Governors were delighted to hear about the successful Year 5 trip to the Isle of Wight, especially as it was the first trip the school had taken to the Isle of Wight in two years.

They also celebrated how the pupils came across so confidently in a recent Governors visit for a Pupil Conference about Science and DT. Governors went on to express their gratitude to Mrs Crinall for an excellent Governor visit focusing on RE and the School's Ethos.

Going forward the Governing Board will be focusing on preparing for a Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) and the recent revised framework.
