YEAR 5 & 6 TRANSITION MORNING AT TWICKENHAM ACADEMY

CHANGES TO THE HOUSE SYSTEM

Currently, the children in Years 1-6 are separated into four houses: Canterbury (red), Salisbury (green), Winchester (blue) and York (yellow). Belonging to a house gives children a sense of being part of team when working towards shared goals and incentives and when participating in larger competitions. Over the years there has been a build-up of some discrepancies in the distribution of children, mostly because a class of 30 children cannot be equally split into four houses and the distribution of siblings (siblings will remain together in the same house). With this in mind, we propose that from September 2022, we will have three houses instead of four so that each class of 30 children is split into three groups of 10. Rather than remove a house, we will create three new houses which children will be assigned to. We will no longer have yellow T-shirts (since this is the BP colour) and use green, red and blue T-shirts. From September all children in Years 1-6 will wear a coloured house T-shirt for their PE lessons. Currently, this is only Years 3-6.

Do you have any ideas for possible names for our houses? Ideally, the house names will be connected to the ethos, values and context of our school and be relevant to the children. Children will be asked to share their ideas by School Council before we make a final decision about the names of the houses. You will be told the house your child will be going into by Friday 8th July.

We will ask nearer the end of term for anyone who has an existing T-shirt that is in good condition to donate it back to the school so that it can be re-sold as part of the School Association second hand uniform sale. We will support any families who need it with the cost of this additional purchase. Coloured T-shirts are sold through the school at cost price of £2 (increasing to £3 in September)

If you are able to help, please let the office know as soon as possible - including how many children you would be able to take.

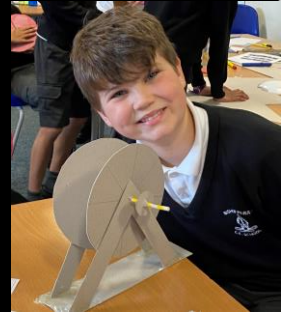
Payment
