If we recycled all our old electricals it would remove as much carbon dioxide as taking 1.3 million cars off the road.





## HOLIDAY ACTIVITY AND FOOD - FUEL - FREE PROGRAMMES FOR CHILDREN ON FSM

The FUEL (Feed Ur Everyday Lives) programme, returns this summer to help support children on benefits-related Free School Meals, and will be on offer throughout the holidays.

After a successful Easter, There are over 18000 spaces available across Kingston and Richmond with holiday activity and food providers, and the programme continues to grow with new locations, providers, and activities available for children across the two boroughs.
