Dear Parents, School Life

Well done to Reception Class on completing their first full week of being part of the Bishop Perrin community! They've had a busy week, and have experienced being on the playground at lunchtimes with all the older children, which I know older siblings have very much enjoyed. No doubt there will be some very tired children by the end of school today, but we know that they will build their stamina and resilience as the weeks go by.

It has been lovely seeing all the before and after-school clubs up and running this week, something that we haven't had since March last year. I hope the children have enjoyed the opportunity to explore and take part in different interests and activities.

Year 6 were visited by a journalist today to help them develop their journalistic writing skills. They really enjoyed learning about the skills involved to write a news report, so we look forward to seeing some of them working for the BBC in the future!

Mrs Chawla, our new Communications and Community Officer, has completed her first full week with us this week and hopefully you will get to know her as the school year progresses. Mrs Chawla is based in the main office working alongside Mrs May.

Governor Maintenance Fund

As parents of Bishop Perrin School, you'll be aware that our school building is owned by our Diocese, the London Diocesan Board of Schools (LDBS), rather than Richmond Council. As such, the school is required to raise funds to contribute to the LDBS and the upkeep of the school building. We achieve our contribution to the LDBS by asking for voluntary donations from parents, based on the number of children they have attending the school. Currently it is £40 per academic year for a first child and then £36 per academic year for any siblings. Any surplus that the Governor Maintenance Fund generates beyond our expected contributions to the LDBS is used by the Governors to help support the school, mainly with the building, but earlier this year, the Fund was able to purchase 30 Chromebooks and a trolley to house them in, to the benefit of all the children. In order to help pay for their contribution to the Maintenance Fund, many parents set up a standing order which helps budget for the contribution over the course of 12 months. The cost therefore of paying £40 over the year equates to £3.33 per month. Where possible, some parents generously round this figure up to £5 per month and sometimes higher. The Governors are able to claim Gift Aid on parental donations, which boosts our funds by 25%, enabling even more money from the main school budget to be saved from paying for building works by having the Maintenance Fund pay for it. Please can I ask that if you haven't made your contribution for this year, or you want to set up a standing order for it, please visit the Maintenance Fund webpage on the school website.
