Reception Class Parents Only – we understand that many of you won't yet have used our school shop payment system. We are in the process of changing providers and in the coming weeks will be inviting the whole school to sign up and register to the new system. Therefore, to prevent you having to sign up to two payment systems, as an exception we are allowing you to pay in cash via the school office for this trip only. If you want to pay online via our current school shop system you are welcome to do so. You will need to contact us for registration steps, but please note you will also be asked to register for the new system when it comes in to use shortly. If you plan on paying in cash please also sign and return the paper permission slip that was given to your child.

Volunteers – once we have established who will be attending from our staff we may need some adult parent/carers volunteers, please keep an eye out for an email inviting parent/carers to sign up. This trip is often very popular with parents/carers and as a result we won't be able to utilise everyone's kind offer to volunteer, we will use a first come first served system to arrange volunteers.

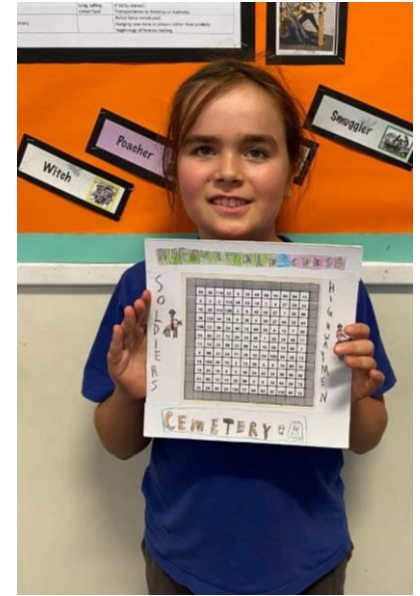
